Mission Statement

The Mountainside Public School District is committed to academic excellence and providing an equitable, whole-child education for all K-8 students to ensure they are well-prepared for high school, and empowered with the knowledge, literacy, and social and emotional skills needed to be lifelong learners and shape the world around them. The District promotes a collaborative and supportive learning environment, infusing a comprehensive curriculum with 21st century skills that encourage communication and innovative, creative and critical thinking. It is our goal that all our students become informed, empathetic and productive citizens who are responsible on a personal, community and global level. The Board of Education, administration, and staff, working together with students, parents and the community, are accountable for achieving this vision.

What Are Our Visions for the Mountainside School District?

On April 30, 2024, Mountainside School District administrators, Board of Education members, staff, parents, and community members came together for the second strategic planning meeting. The topic for the second meeting was focused on developing a vision and initiatives toward achieving that vision, for the Mountainside School District. Mrs. Janet Walling and Board President, Vivian Pupo introduced facilitators Patti Rees and Jeanne Cleary, from the New Jersey School Boards Association (NJSBA), who provided an overview of the strategic planning process and the focus for the evening's activity.

We reviewed the consensus process utilized in strategic planning. The topic for the evening focused on creating a shared vision for the Mountainside School District. We were then asked to imagine — what if, in five years' time, at the maturation of the strategic plan we are creating, Mountainside Public Schools had become a nationally recognized school district for providing an outstanding education for its students? What if the national media was writing about the Mountainside so public-school districts nationwide could emulate what happens *here*?

Participants gathered in randomly assigned groups, five groups in total, to develop a shared vision and initiatives. After group discussion, each group identified their consensus points and presented those to the larger group.



The information that follows is a summary of the work of the small groups. As discussed with the meeting participants, all consensus points are recorded and posted on the district website to share the group work during the strategic planning process.
